SC: Absence of JV Agreement Not a Ground for Disqualification Unless Explicitly Required in NIT

The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Maha Mineral Mining & Beneficiation Pvt. Ltd. v. Madhya Pradesh Power Generating Co. Ltd. & Anr. (2025 SCC OnLine SC 1942), dated on September 9, 2025, held that a bidder cannot be disqualified for non-submission of a joint venture agreement when the Notice Inviting Tender (NIT) does not expressly mandate it, and authorities must apply tender...

NH Act: Scope of Reference to Civil Court under Section 3H (4)

The Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in the case of Saravanabhava v. The District Collector and Ors., (WA No. 2098 of 2025), delivered on September 12, 2025, clarified that under Section 3H (4) of the National Highways Act, 1956, only those disputes that the competent authority under the National Highways Act cannot decide without adjudication, such as uncertainty in title or apportionment...

OTS Not a Matter of Right: Mandatory Upfront Payment a Precondition for Consideration of Application

The Supreme Court in Assistant General Manager, State Bank of India v. Tanya Energy Enterprises (2025 SCC OnLine SC 1979), dated September 15, 2025, has held that a borrower cannot claim the benefit of a one-time settlement (OTS) as of right unless the eligibility conditions stipulated in the scheme are strictly fulfilled and that failure to make the mandatory upfront...



Sanctity of Tender Process Prevails: No Alteration of BOQ Once Financial Bids Opened

The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Prakash Asphaltings and Toll Highways (India) Limited v. Mandeepa Enterprises and Others, (2025 SCC OnLine SC 1959), dated September 12, 2025, held that once financial bids in a tender are opened, a bidder cannot amend, reinterpret, or rectify its bid under any circumstances, even if there is a bona fide mistake.

NCLAT Reaffirms Mandatory Admission of Section 7 IBC Applications Upon Proof of Debt and Default

The National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) in the case of Vikram Bhawanishankar Sharma v. Union Bank of India & Anr. (2025 SCC OnLine NCLAT 1460), dated September 11, 2025, reaffirmed that once debt and default are established, admission of an application under Section 7 of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC), 2016, is mandatory and cannot be defeated...

In a recent ruling the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of M. Rajendran & Ors. v. M/s KPK Oils and Proteins India Pvt. Ltd. & Ors., (2025 INSC 1137), dated September 22, 2025, reiterated the legal position on the right of redemption under Section 13(8) of the Securitisation and Reconstruction of Financial Assets and...
